SENATE AMENDMENT " A " to S.P. 957, L.D. 2421, Bill, "An Act Regarding the Administration of the Maine Children's Trust Fund"

Amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and before the statement of fact:

'22 MRSA §3724, sub-§11 is enacted to read:

11. Study of options for administrative assistance. To facilitate the management, administration and distribution of fund money, the board shall conduct a study of the potential positive and negative consequences of entering into a contract with a statewide public foundation created to attract and manage charitable funds and to distribute the income to Maine nonprofit organizations to help solve community problems and enhance the quality of life in the State. The board shall report its finding to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over human resource matters no later than January 15, 1991, along with its recommendations for any legislative action based on these findings.'

**STATEMENT OF FACT**

The purpose of this amendment is to increase the proportion of the Maine Children's Trust Fund money that is granted to community prevention programs, either through increased income or through reduced administrative costs, or both. The board is required to conduct a study in cooperation with a statewide public foundation created to attract and manage charitable funds, such as the Maine Community Foundation, Inc., to determine


