Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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3 Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §3724, sub-§10, as enacted by PL 1987, c. 402,
4 Pt. A, §142, is repealed.

 Sec. 2. 22 MRSA §3724, sub-§11 is enacted to read:

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9 11. Administration assistance. To facilitate the
10 management, administration and distribution of fund money, the
11 board shall enter into a contract with a statewide public
12 foundation created to attract and manage charitable funds and to
13 distribute the income to Maine nonprofit organizations to help
14 solve community problems and enhance the quality of life in the
15 State.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

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21 The purpose of this bill is to reduce the amount of Maine
22 Children's Trust Fund money that is used to administer the fund.
23 Under current law, the Board of the Maine Children's Trust Fund
24 may employ 2 full-time staff persons. This bill eliminates those
25 staff positions and requires instead that, in order to facilitate
26 the administration of fund money, the board enter into a contract
with a statewide public foundation created to attract and manage
charitable funds, such as the Maine Community Foundation.
