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Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act takes effect when approved.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

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This bill provides that the Aid to Families with Dependent Children standard of need and payment maximum will be increased each year by the rate of inflation during the previous calendar year.

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
