Resolve, to Reauthorize the Commission to Evaluate the Adequacy of the Aid to Families with Dependent Children Need and Payment Standards.



2           **Sec. 1. Commission reauthorized; membership. Resolved:** That  
the Commission to Evaluate the Adequacy of the Aid to Families  
4 with Dependent Children Need and Payment Standards established by  
Public Law 1989, chapter 501, Part S, is reauthorized. The  
6 current members of the commission continue in office and the  
duties of the commission remain as defined in chapter 501; and be  
it further

8           **Sec. 2. Meetings. Resolved:** That the chair of the commission  
10 shall call a meeting of the commission by August 15, 1990. The  
commission is authorized to meet up to 6 times; and be it further

12           **Sec. 3. Report. Resolved:** That the commission shall submit  
14 its report, together with any necessary implementing legislation,  
to the First Regular Session of the 115th Legislature and to the  
16 Office of the Executive Director of the Legislative Council by  
February 15, 1991; and be it further

18           **Sec. 4. Staff assistance. Resolved:** That the Department of Human  
20 Services shall provide sufficient staff assistance to the  
commission to carry out its duties; and be it further

22           **Sec. 5. Reimbursement. Resolved:** That the members of the  
24 commission who are Legislators are entitled to receive the  
legislative per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes,  
26 Title 3, section 2, for days of attendance at commission  
meetings. All members of the commission who are not state  
28 employees shall be entitled to expenses, as defined in the Maine  
Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 12002, upon application to the  
30 Executive Director of the Legislative Council for those expenses;  
and be it further

32           **Sec. 6. Appropriation. Resolved:** That the following funds are  
34 appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of  
this resolve.
