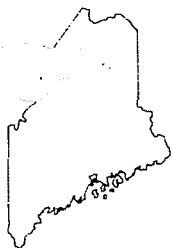

**An Act to Provide Funds for a Design Competition for the
Construction of a New Supreme Judicial Court Facility in Augusta.**



2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

4 **Appropriation.** The following funds are appropriated from
the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.

22 **STATEMENT OF FACT**

24 This bill provides funds from the General Fund to hold a
26 2-stage design competition for selection of the design for
construction of a Supreme Judicial Court facility on the east
28 bank of the Kennebec River on a direct axis with the State
Capitol Building. A 7-member jury selected by the Supreme
30 Judicial Court Plan and Design Commission will oversee and
evaluate the design competition. The jury will consist of a
32 majority of persons in architecturally related professions and 3
other persons.
