This bill provides funds from the General Fund to hold a 2-stage design competition for selection of the design for construction of a Supreme Judicial Court facility on the east bank of the Kennebec River on a direct axis with the State Capitol Building. A 7-member jury selected by the Supreme Judicial Court Plan and Design Commission will oversee and evaluate the design competition. The jury will consist of a majority of persons in architecturally related professions and 3 other persons.
