16	Amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and before the emergency clause and inserting in its place
18	the following:
20	'Sec. 1. Educational waivers; informational meetings. The Commissioner of Educational and Cultural Services shall meet with
22	appropriate organizations and professional associations to discuss the availability of educational mandate waivers and to
24	disseminate information on the criteria and procedure for waiving implementation of educational mandates by school administrative
26	units. Among the organizations and associations with whom the commissioner shall meet are the statewide organizations
28	representing school superintendents, secondary and elementary school principals, school boards, teachers and municipal
30	governments.
32	Sec. 2. Informational letters. Prior to July 1, 1990, the Commissioner of Educational and Cultural Services shall send an
34	informational letter to school superintendents, school boards and municipal officials describing the criteria and procedure for
36	granting waivers of state educational mandates.
38	Sec. 3. Technical assistance. The Commissioner of Educational
40	and Cultural Services shall provide technical assistance to superintendents, principals and school boards to determine
42	eligibility for the waiver of educational mandates, to apply for an educational mandate waiver and to plan for coming into
44	compliance with the mandate so that, as soon as possible, the waiver will no longer be necessary.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1788, L.D. 2457

2 Sec. 4. Report. By January 1, 1991, the commissioner shall report to the Joint Standing Committee on Education on the status of educational mandate waivers. The report must include the 4 number of waivers requested and granted, the mandates or requirements from which waivers were sought, the reasons for the 6 waiver requests, an evaluation of the waiver program and recommendations on the continued need for educational mandate 8 waivers. 10 Sec. 5. Repeal. This Act is repealed on July 1, 1991.' 12 Further amend the bill by inserting after the emergency clause and before the statement of fact the following: 14 **'FISCAL NOTE** 16 The Department of Educational and Cultural Services will 18 incur some minor additional costs that can be absorbed within existing budgeted resources.' 20 22 STATEMENT OF FACT 24 This amendment replaces the original bill. The amendment 26 requires the Commissioner of Educational and Cultural Services to meet with appropriate statewide organizations and professional 28 associations to discuss and disseminate information on waivers 30 for educational mandates, to disseminate information to superintendents and school boards on waivers, to provide technical assistance to superintendents, principals and school 32 boards wishing to apply for waivers and to report to the Joint

34 Standing Committee on Education on the status of education mandate waivers by January 1, 1991.
