IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND NINETY

An Act to Provide a Salary Payment Option for Legislators.

(EMERGENCY)

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, certain Legislators receive Social Security 6 retirement benefits; and

8 Whereas, the current system of unequal annual payments of a Legislator's salary causes a reduction of Social Security 10 retirement benefits in the first year of the biennium; and

 12 Whereas, unless this legislation takes effect immediately, this problem will adversely affect retired Legislators this year;

16 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of 18 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 20 safety; now, therefore,

22 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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3 MRSA §2, first ¶, as affected by PL 1989, c. 878, Pt. D, §§14 and 15, is amended to read:

Each member of the Senate and House of Representatives, beginning with the first Wednesday of December 2.8 1990 and thereafter, shall-receive is entitled to \$10,500 in the first year and \$7,500 in the 2nd year of each biennium, and-shall-30 except that if a Legislator who is a recipient of retirement benefits from the federal Social Security Administration files a 32 written request with the Executive Director of the Legislative Council within one week after the biennium commences, the 34 Legislator is entitled to \$9,000 in each year of the biennium. In addition, each Legislator is entitled to be paid for travel at 36 each legislative session once each week at the same rate per mile to and from that Legislator's place of abode as state employees 38 receive, the mileage to be determined by the most reasonable 40 direct route, except that Legislators may be reimbursed for tolls paid for travel on the Maine Turnpike provided they have a 42 receipt for payment of the tolls, such tolls to be reimbursed when Legislators use the Maine Turnpike in traveling to and from sessions of the Legislature or in performance of duly authorized 44 committee assignments. Each Legislator is entitled to mileage on the first day of the session, and such amounts of salary and 46 expenses at such times as the Legislature may determine during 48 the session, and the balance at the end thereof.

50 **Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act takes effect when approved.

STATEMENT OF FACT

б This bill creates an optional method of payment of a Legislator's salary if a Legislator is a recipient of Social Security retirement benefits. Current law provides for a salary 8 of \$10,500 in the first year of the biennium and \$7,500 in the 2nd year. This bill allows a qualified Legislator to elect to 10 receive a salary of \$9,000 in each year of the biennium. The Legislator must notify the Executive Director of the Legislative 12 Council, in writing, of the Legislator's desire to pursue this 14 optional method of payment. This notice must be provided within one week of the commencement of the biennium or the Legislator's 16 salary remains in unequal amounts for each year of the biennium. This option allows a Legislator the option of ensuring that the Legislator's Social Security retirement benefits will not be 18 adversely affected by legislative service.

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
