**An Act to Require that Measurable Material Sold at Retail Be Less
Expensive Per Unit of Measurement as the Package Size Increases.**



Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

10 MRSA §2630 is enacted to read:

§2630. Unit pricing

Any measurable commodity sold at retail must be less expensive per unit of measurement as the packaging size increases. Whenever a smaller packaging size is advertised at a sale price, the larger packaging size must remain at a lesser price per unit of measurement than the smaller packaging size.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill requires retailers to sell commodities in larger packages at a lesser price per unit of measure than commodities sold in smaller packages.
