### STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND NINETY

Resolve, Authorizing Mark Tamecki to Bring a Civil Action against the State.



Authorization to sue the State. Resolved: That, notwithstanding any statute or common law to the contrary, Mark Tamecki, or his legal representative, who claims to have suffered damages as a result of an alleged clerical error in title records maintained by the Department of the Secretary of State, Division of Motor Vehicles, is authorized to bring a civil action against the State of Maine, but not against individual past or present employees of the State.

This action may be brought in the Cumberland County Superior Court within one year from the date this resolve is approved. Liability and damages, including punitive damages, must be determined according to state law as in litigation between individuals. The action may be heard by a Justice of the Superior Court or by a jury. The Maine Rules of Civil Procedure govern the conduct of the action. The Attorney General shall appear, answer and defend the action.

The Treasurer of State shall\pay any judgment, including costs and interest, on final process issued by the Superior Court or, if applicable, the Supreme Judicial Court. Recovery may not exceed \$75,000, including costs and interest.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

This resolve authorizes Mark Tamecki to sue the State for damages resulting from an alleged clerical error in title records maintained by the Division of Motor Vehicles, which resulted in Mr. Tamecki's gross overpayment for a 1979 model truck and in the payment of higher insurance coverage and excise tax.
