An Act to Change the Date for Statewide Primary Election.



Be it enacted by the People of the State of I	Maine as f	follows:

Sec. 1. 21-A MRSA §334, as enacted by PL 1985, c. 161, §6, is amended to read:

§334. Qualification of candidate for primary nomination

A candidate for nomination by primary election must file a primary petition and consent under sections 335 and 336. He The candidate for nomination must be enrolled, on or before April June 1st, in the party named in the petition and must be eligible to file a petition as a candidate for nomination by primary election under section 144, subsection 3. The registrar in the candidate's municipality of residence must certify to that fact upon the petition.

- Sec. 2. 21-A MRSA §335, sub-§8, as enacted by PL 1985, c. 161, §6, is amended to read:
- 20 **8.** When filed. A primary petition must be filed in the office of the Secretary of State before 5 p.m. on April June 1st 22 of the election year in which it is to be used.

§339. Time and nature of election

The primary election shall must be held on the 2nd Tuesday ef--June in September of each general election year and is considered to be a separate election for each party which takes part in it. This includes the duties of public officials in announcing the election, providing forms and ballots, keeping records and any other matter necessary to effect the purpose of a primary election. A primary election shall must be conducted the same as the general election, as nearly as practicable, for each party.

The purpose of this bill is to change the date from the 2nd Tuesday in June to the 2nd Tuesday in September for any statewide primary election.
