An Act Related to Pool Enclosures within 150 Feet of a Lake or Stream.



Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:													
	read	22 MRSA	§1632,	as	enacted	bу	PL	1983,	c.	436,	is	amended	to

§1632. Enclosure of swimming pool required

A fence shall must be erected and maintained around every swimming pool, except that portable above-ground swimming pools with sidewalls of at least 24 inches in height and swimming pools located within 150 feet of a great pond, stream or other shoreland zoning area are exempted. A dwelling house or accessory building may be used as part of this enclosure. All gates or doors opening through this enclosure shall must be capable of being securely fastened at all times when not in actual use.

STATEMENT OF FACT

Under this bill, a swimming pool located within 150 feet of a great pond, stream or other shoreland zoning area is exempt from the law requiring fences around swimming pools.
