Sec. 2. Effective date. This Act takes effect on January 1, 1992.

FISCAL NOTE

This bill changes complimentary licenses issued to residents 70 years of age or older from being renewed every 2 years to making the licenses permanent. Such a change will result in negligible savings to the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife in postage and computer time. These savings will be offset by an expected increase in costs for the issuance of a more durable Tyvek license.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment changes the bill so that the permanent complimentary licenses issued to residents over 70 years of age are not limited to fishing licenses but include hunting, trapping, archery hunting and muzzle-loaded hunting licenses. This amendment also makes any permanent licenses invalid if the license holder no longer meets the residency requirements set out in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 12, section 7001, subsection 32. The amendment adds a section to the bill making the bill effective on January 1, 1992. The emergency preamble and emergency clause are removed from the bill. The amendment also adds a fiscal note.
