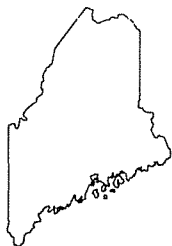

An Act to Change the Scalloping Season.



Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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12 MRSA §6722, as amended by PL 1983, c. 685, is further amended to read:

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§6722. Closed areas

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Unless modified by rule or regulation adopted under section 6171-A, it is unlawful to fish for or take scallops in the coastal waters from April 16th to ~~October--31st,--both--days~~ inclusive November 30th.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

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This bill extends the period of time during which scallop harvesting is prohibited. The phrase "both days inclusive" is stricken as redundant, as this construction applies to all statutory dates pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 1, section 71, subsection 5.
