An Act Concerning Traffic Control for Road Construction Projects.



Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

23 MRSA §1352 is enacted to read:

§1352. Traffic control training

1. Rules. The Department of Transportation shall adopt and enforce rules relating to traffic control training. A person, other than a law enforcement officer, who is hired to control traffic during construction of a public highway must be trained in traffic control.

2. Traffic control. A person may not control traffic during construction of a public highway unless that person is a law enforcement officer or has been trained in traffic control under rules adopted by the department.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill requires that the Department of Transportation promulgate rules that will regulate the hiring of people to direct traffic during road construction. The bill also requires that people who control traffic be law enforcement officers or be trained in traffic control.
