STATEMENT OF FACT

The Department of Human Services has statutory authority to inspect and license boarding homes and foster homes for dependent elderly and disabled residents statewide. This bill provides funds for 4 additional Social Service Program Specialist I positions and 2 Casework Supervisors to assist in the inspection and licensing of adult boarding care facilities to better serve the needs of the State's elderly and disabled populations.
