An Act Concerning Consent to Dental Care.



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#### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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### 24 MRSA §2905, sub-§1-A is enacted to read:

1-A. Consent for treatment of a minor. A recovery may not be allowed against any dentist or any health care provider upon the grounds that dental treatment was rendered without the parent's or guardian's consent for dental care of a minor child, if consent to the care has been given by a parent or a guardian of the minor. The immunity provided by this subsection applies whether:

A. The parents are married, unmarried or separated at the time of consent or treatment;

<u>B. The consenting parent is, or is not, a custodial parent</u> of the minor; and

C. The giving of consent by a parent is, or is not, full performance of any agreement between the parents, or any order or decree in any action under Title 19, section 214.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

26 This bill revises the informed consent to health care treatment provision of the Maine Health Security Act by changing 28 the circumstances in which immunity is accorded to dentists and health care providers rendering dental treatment to a minor.

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
