An Act to Prohibit Shooting from or across an Accepted Road.

	subsection, an accepted road has the same meaning as found in
14	Title 38, section 952, subsection 1.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill prohibits hunting from an accepted road. An accepted road is a state, county or town road that is under the control of state, county or municipal authorities and maintained at public expense.
