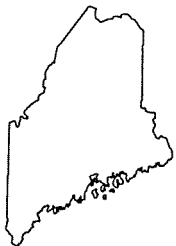

**An Act to Facilitate the Reimbursement of Deposits on Pesticide
Containers.**



Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

2
4 22 MRSA §1471-Q, sub-§6-A is enacted to read:

6 6-A. Verification of triple rinsing. In addition to return
and refund procedures established by the board, employees of the
8 board shall inspect containers to verify triple rinsing if:

10 A. During the course of duties an employee is at a location
where pesticide containers are stored; and

12 B. The person who has ownership or control of the container
14 requests inspection.

16 Upon verification that containers have been triple rinsed or the
equivalent, the inspector shall provide an affidavit identifying
18 the containers and stating the date and place of inspection.

20 STATEMENT OF FACT

22 This bill facilitates the reimbursement of deposits on
24 pesticide containers by directing inspectors with the Board of
26 Pesticides Control to inspect containers during their normal
course of work. Authorized collection, disposal, or recycling
facilities typically require the Board of Pesticides Control
verification of triple rinsing prior to accepting the containers.
