STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND NINETY-ONE

An Act to Amend the Board of Counseling Professionals Licensure Laws.

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2	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2 4	Sec. 1. 32 MRSA §13852, sub-§2, as amended by PL 1989, c. 895,
4 6	$\S4$ and affected by $\S21$, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:
8	2. Members. The board consists of the following 14 voting members, each of whom must be a citizen of the United States and
10	a resident of the State. The Governor shall appoint the members in paragraphs A to C as follows.
12	
14	A. Eight members must be counseling professionals licensed under this chapter and include 2 counselors, 2 clinical professional counselors, 2 marriage and family therapists
16	and 2 pastoral counselors. Each of these members must have been actively engaged as a practitioner, educator or
18	<u>researcher for at least 5 years immediately preceding</u> appointment.
20	<u>B. Two members must be counseling professionals who are not licensed but meet the registration requirements of this</u>
22	chapter and will be registered by October 1, 1992. After that date these 2 members must be registered.
24	<u>C. Three members must be representatives of the general</u>
26	public and may not be currently practicing counseling or receiving compensation for counseling services. One of
28	these members must be a consumer of counseling services.
30	<u>D. One member, appointed by the Chancellor of the University of Maine System, must be a member of the</u>
32	university faculty involved in the training of counselors.
34	Sec. 2. Transition provisions. The Governor shall appoint the 2 counselors who meet registration requirements and will be
36	registered by October 1, 1992 to the board for 3-year terms. Their successors must be appointed pursuant to provisions that
38	apply to all other board members. The terms of appointment for all other board members established prior to the effective date
40	of this Act are not affected by this law.
42	STATEMENT OF FACT
44	This bill repeals and replaces the current law concerning
46	membership of the Board of Counseling Professionals Licensure in order to make it more understandable.
48	At present the Board of Counseling Professionals Licensure
50	is comprised of 13 members including one nonvoting member who is a counselor "currently not qualified for licensure." This bill
52	increases the size of the board to 14 members and includes 2 voting members who are counselors not licensed under this chapter
54	but who will be registered by October 1, 1992.
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
