HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 86,  
L.D. 121, Bill, "An Act to Implement the Recommendations of the  
Travel Information Advisory Council Concerning Informational  
Signs"

Amend the amendment in "Sec. 2." in paragraph F by striking  
out all of the first paragraph (page 2, lines 3 to 11 in  
amendment) and inserting in its place the following:

'F. Signs erected by farmers advertising fresh fruit, berry  
and vegetable crops in season from June 15th to November 1st  
of each year. These signs must be removed by November 1st  
of each year and must be erected on private property with  
the landowner's permission. These signs are limited to 2  
signs. The signs must conform to standard department  
requirements for official business directional signs.  
Notwithstanding section 1911, subsection 2, if a farmer  
erects signs under this paragraph, the farmer may not be  
issued more than 4 licenses for official business  
directional signs.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment allows signs on private property only, not on  
certain highway rights-of-way. The amendment also limits the  
number of signs to 2 and requires that the signs meet the  
Department of Transportation requirements for official business  
directional signs. The amendment also limits the number of  
official business directional signs that may be used by farmers  
who use the 2 signs authorized in this amendment.
