An Act Concerning Federal Impact Aid for Education.

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2	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
4	Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §15612, sub-§5, ¶A, as enacted by PL 1983, c. 859, Pt. G, §§2 and 4, is amended to read:

40	STATEMENT OF FACT
42	This bill provides a different method of reducing the state subsidy to school administrative units that receive federal
44	impact aid. It allows each unit to retain federal impact aid to cover costs for those students above the subsidized amounts and
46	subtracting any additional amounts from the state subsidy of the unit. Current law requires local units to subtract from the
48	state subsidy an amount equal to the impact aid received, multiplied by a fraction equal to subsidizable costs in the base
50	year divided by all costs in the base year.

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
