Resolve, to Establish the Commission to Study Lobster Trap Limits.

(EMERGENCY)

Contrate State of the state of

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

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Whereas, the health of the lobster industry is dependent upon effective resource management; and

Whereas, this commission must begin its work by July 1st in order to complete its work by November 1st; and

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Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

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- Sec. 1. Commission established. Resolved: That the Commission to Study Lobster Trap Limits is established; and be it further
- Sec. 2. Appointment. Resolved: That the commission consists of 20 members: 13 must be Legislators who are members of the Joint Standing Committee on Marine Resources in the First Regular Session of the 115th Legislature; the Commissioner of Marine Resources or the commissioner's designee; and 6 members of the public appointed jointly by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives. Of the 6 public members 2 must be lobster harvesters, 2 must be lobster dealers and one must be engaged in the business of importing or exporting lobsters; and be it further

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Convening of commission. 3. Resolved: appointments must be made no later than 30 days after the effective date of this resolve. The Executive Director of the Legislative Council must be notified by all authorities when the selections have been made. The Chair of the Legislative Council shall call the first meeting of commission by July 1, 1990. The commission shall select a Legislator from its membership as chair; and be it further

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Sec. 4. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall meet 5 times to study the need for lobster trap limits. The commission shall review proposals to establish a lobster trap limit and shall evaluate the costs and benefits to the lobster industry and to the people of the State of proposals to establish lobster trap limits; and be it further

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Sec. 5. Report. Resolved: That the commission shall present its findings, together with any recommended legislation, to the Second Regular Session of the 115th Legislature by November 1, 1991; and be it further

	Sec. 6. Assistance. Resolved: That the commission shall

	to carry out these duties. The commission may also call upon the

6	Sec. 7. Compensation. Resolved: That the members of the
	commission who are Legislators are entitled to receive the
