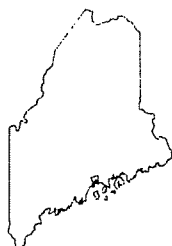

**An Act to Require a State Police Station to Be Located within Five Miles
of a State Maximum Security Prison.**



Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

25 MRSA §1501, as amended by PL 1985, c. 785, Pt. B, §108, is further amended by adding after the 2nd paragraph a new paragraph to read:

The Chief of the State Police, in the assignment of staff and resources, shall ensure that a state police station, staffed and operational at all times, is located and maintained within 5 miles of any state maximum security prison.
