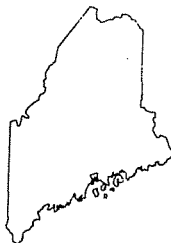

An Act Concerning Succession to the Position of Treasurer of State.



Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

2
4 5 MRSA §121, 3rd ¶, as amended by PL 1975, c. 771, §34, is further amended to read:

6 The chief clerk in the office of the Treasurer of State shall-be is designated as "deputy treasurer of state." In the
8 event of a vacancy in the office of Treasurer of State, the deputy treasurer of state shall act as the Treasurer of State
10 until a Treasurer of State is elected by the Legislature at the next regular or special session of the Legislature. During the
12 absence or disability of the Treasurer of State, the deputy treasurer of state shall perform the duties of the office. When a
14 vacancy occurs, he the deputy treasurer of state shall give bond to the State, with sureties, to the satisfaction of the Governor,
16 for the faithful discharge of his the deputy's trust.

20 **STATEMENT OF FACT**

22 The purpose of this bill is to clarify current law by
24 stating that a successor to the office of Treasurer of State may be elected at the next special or regular session of the Legislature.
