strategies that support the efforts of state and private agencies to enhance recruitment and retention of health professionals in

2. Recruitment of state residents. Develop and implement a statewide plan for enhancing the recruitment of state residents into health professions, especially those residents who are disadvantaged or members of insufficiently represented populations;

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3. Needs assessment. Conduct statewide studies, establish data management mechanisms and undertake any other activities that improve the State's ability to assess the need for health professionals and health profession education;

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4. Clinical and continuing education. Develop a statewide plan for conducting clinical and continuing education programs for health professionals that use community-based and culturally appropriate curricula;

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5. Contracts. Establish contractual relationships to carry out system plans with health profession education programs, the statewide center for continuing education in the health professions, and regional centers;

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6. Assistance to regional centers. Provide technical and administrative services to the regional centers and the statewide center for continuing education in the health professions and coordinate their efforts to ensure effective and efficient utilization of state resources in carrying out system plans;

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7. System funds. Manage system funds in accordance with policies developed under this chapter and develop and implement plans to raise public and private funds to promote the goals of the system;

46	STATEMENT OF FACT
48	This bill formally links previously established components
50	of Maine's health education network to create the Maine Area Health Education Centers System. The system, created under the
52	auspices of the Finance Authority of Maine and governed by the Maine Area Health Education Centers Commission, is responsible

for addressing the State's health care personnel needs,
2 particularly for areas and populations that need additional health care services. Present efforts in this area are fragmented and are threatened by diminished federal funding.
