24	The first regular session of the Legislature, after - its- eenvening, - shall must adjourn no later than the 3rd Wednesday in
26	June May and the 2nd regular session of the Legislature shall must adjourn no later than the 3rd first Wednesday in April. The
28	Legislature, in case of emergency, may by a vote of 2/3 of the members of each House present and voting, extend the date for
30	adjournment for the first or 2nd regular session by no more than
32	5 legislative days, and in case of further emergency, may by a vote of 2/3 of the members of each House present and voting, further extend the date for adjournment by 5 additional
34	legislative days. The times for adjournment for the first and 2nd regular sessions may also be extended for one additional
36	legislative day for the purpose of considering possible objections of the Governor to any bill or resolution presented to
38	him the Governor by the Legislature under the Constitution of Maine, Article IV, Part Third, Section 2. The date for
40	submission of legislation for the first regular session is the first Tuesday after the first Monday in December.

12	of the Legislature will reduce legislative staff payroll expenses, printing costs and Legislators' expenses.
14	These savings may be reduced by pending legislative actions
16	on the current services budget. The Governor's proposed budget includes reductions to the legislative budget that may conflict
18	with and prevent the realization of the amount of savings identified above.'

22	STATEMENT OF FACT
24	This amendment eliminates the rollback of the increase in legislative payments passed in 1989 proposed in the original bill.
26	
28	The amendment changes the adjournment dates for both sessions. Current law sets adjournment for the first regular
& O	session on the 3rd Wednesday in June. The original bill shortens
30	the session by 10 weeks. This amendment shortens the first regular session by 5 weeks. Current law sets adjournment of the
32	2nd regular session for the 3rd Wednesday in April. The original bill shortens the session by 6 weeks. This amendment shortens
34	the 2nd regular session by 2 weeks.
36	This amendment does not affect the prohibition against Friday sessions except for the last 4 Fridays of a regular
38	session.
