STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment adds an emergency preamble and clause to the bill. It allows the Secretary of State to sell flag plates independent of the registration process and prescribes how they must be attached to a registered vehicle. It authorizes municipal agents to issue flag plates and collect a \$1 service charge. It also adds an allocation and fiscal note.
