	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

4	<b>12 MRSA §6421, sub-§3-A,</b> as enacted by PL 1989, c. 455, §2, is amended to read:
6	<b>3-A. License limitation.</b> A license shallauthorize- authorizes activities by individuals as follows.

10	A. A Class I license sha <del>ll-only-authorize</del> <u>authorizes</u> the licensed activities by <u>only</u> the individual who is named in the license. Any individual assisting or helping a Class I
12	license holder in these activities sha <del>ll</del> <u>must</u> also be licensed.

16	B. A Class II license sha <del>ll</del> authorize <u>authorizes</u> the license holder to engage in the licensed activities. A
