An Act to Permit Larger Docks Within the Saco River Corridor.



	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

6	C. On the Ossipee and <u>River</u> , Little Ossipee Rivers <u>River</u> and fresh-water <u>freshwater</u> portions of the Saco River:

10	float shall <u>may</u> extend more than 10% of the width of the river at any time or extend into the water more

	(2) All piers, docks or floats shall must be temporary

20	STATEMENT OF FACT
22	Presently, Maine law requires that no privately owned pier, dock or float on the Ossipee River, Little Ossipee River and
24	freshwater portions of the Saco River may extend more than 10% of
E4 TE	the width of the river at any time or extend into the water more
26	than 10 feet perpendicular to the shore, whichever is less. This
	bill provides that the formula be changed from a 10-foot to a

20-foot extension from the shore.

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
