An Act to Ban Waterskiing on Certain Parts of the Saco River.



Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Waterskiing on certain parts of the Saco River prohibited.
Notwithstanding any waiver of a rule by the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife, waterskiing is prohibited on the Saco River from the point where Route 1, commonly known as Elm Street in Biddeford and Saco, crosses the Saco River to Skelton Dam at Union Falls.

The Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife granted a waiver to allow waterskiing on a certain part of the Saco River upon the request for waiver by the Biddeford City Council. The city council then voted to withdraw the request, but the department has not rescinded the waiver. This bill makes the waiver ineffective and prohibits waterskiing on the Saco River from the point where Route 1 crosses the river to Skelton Dam at Union Falls.
