IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND NINETY-ONE

An Act to Make Changes in the Quahog Tax Laws.

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 36 MRSA §4711, sub-§4 is enacted to read:

 4. Toxin Monitoring Fund. "Toxin Monitoring Fund" means a
6 dedicated revenue fund that consists of money collected pursuant to the mahogany guahog tax and established for the purpose of
8 testing guahog beds for toxin levels.

Sec. 2. 36 MRSA §4718 is enacted to read:

12 §4718. Toxin Monitoring Fund

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The Toxin Monitoring Fund is established within the Department of Marine Resources for the purpose of providing needed testing of quahog beds to determine the degree of toxins.

18 Income derived from the mahogany quahog tax and collected by the Bureau of Taxation must be deposited in this fund. The fund 20 may not lapse but must carry forward to be used for the same purpose. These funds are to be used in addition to current money 22 budgeted by the Department of Marine Resources for toxin testing. All funds of the Toxin Monitoring Fund are subject to 24 allocation by the Legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to establish a dedicated "Toxin 30 Monitoring Fund" to be administered by the Department of Marine Resources to provide toxin testing of quahog beds along our 32 coastal waters.

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
