An Act to Replace Certain Criminal Fines with Community Service.



### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

When the court sentences a convicted person to pay a fine, the court may give the person the option of providing community service or participating in another alternative sentencing program instead of paying part or all of the fine. The court shall determine the appropriate community service or other alternative available to the convicted person and the amount of the fine to be waived.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill gives judges discretion when imposing fines for committing crimes. This allows judges to prescribe specific community service or another alternative sentencing program. A convicted person may choose the alternative rather than pay all or part of the fine.
