16	Amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting
18	clause and before the statement of fact and inserting in its place the following:
20	'5 MRSA §1812-E is enacted to read:
22	<u>§1812-E. Purchasing of vehicles; fuel efficiency</u>
24	Except for cars and light duty trucks purchased for law
	enforcement and other special use purposes as designated by the
26	<u>State Purchasing Agent, the State Purchasing Agent may not</u> purchase or lease any car or light duty truck for use by the
28	State or any department or agency of the State unless:
30	1. 1993 standards. Beginning January 1, 1993, the car has
	<u>a manufacturer's estimated highway mileage rating of at least 30</u>
32	<u>miles per gallon and the light duty truck has a manufacturer's</u> estimated highway mileage rating of at least 24 miles per gallon;
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	2. 1997 standards. Beginning January 1, 1997, the car has
36	a manufacturer's estimated highway mileage rating of at least 38
	miles per gallon and the light duty truck has a manufacturer's
38	<u>estimated highway mileage rating of at least 30 miles per gallon; and </u>
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	3. 2000 standards. Beginning January 1, 2000, the car has
42	a manufacturer's estimated highway mileage rating of at least 45 miles per gallon and the light duty truck has a manufacturer's
44	estimated highway mileage rating of at least 35 miles per gallon.

2	For the purposes of this section, the terms "car" and "light
	<u>duty truck" have the same meaning as in the federal Department of</u>
4	Energy Publication DOE/CE-0019/10, or any successor publication.
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	FISCAL NOTE
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Ŭ	This bill requires that all cars or light duty trucks,
10	except law enforcement vehicles, purchased by the State after
10	January 1, 1993, meet minimum fuel efficiency standards. An
12	indeterminable amount of savings will occur as a result of lower
12	-
7.4	fuel consumption through the operation of more fuel-efficient
14	vehicles.'

20	This amendment replaces the original bill and:
22	1. Expands the exemption from the mileage requirements to
	vehicles purchased for other special use purposes as designated
24	by the State Purchasing Agent;
26	2. Requires, in addition to vehicles purchased by the
	State, cars and light duty trucks that are leased to be subject
28	to the mileage requirements; and
30	3. Establishes separate mileage requirements for light duty
	trucks that are lower than the mileage requirements for cars.
