STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment lengthens the time period for filing a 8 Uniform Traffic Ticket and Complaint from the 3 days suggested in the bill to 5 days. The Maine Revised Statutes, Title 1, section 10 71, subsection 12 provides that time periods established by law must be computed under the Maine Rules of Civil Procedure, Rule 6(a) for civil cases and the Maine Rules of Criminal Procedure, 12 Rule 45(a) for criminal cases. These rules provide that when a period of less than 7 days is prescribed, intermediate Saturdays, 14 Sundays and holidays are excluded in the computation. In short, 16 this means that law enforcement officers have 5 business days after the Uniform Traffic Ticket and Complaint is issued to file 18 it with the court.
