An Act to Extend the Right to Purchase Service Credits to State Employees Who Had Military Service in Grenada or Panama.



Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

	5 MRSA §17760, sub-§2, ¶E, as amended by PL 1989, c. 9	907, §3
1	is further amended to read:	

E. A member who served in the armed forces during any federally recognized period of conflict, as defined in Title 37-B, section 504, subsection 4, paragraph A-1, subparagraph (3), or who served in Grenada at any time from October 23, 1983 to November 21, 1983, or in Panama from December 20, 1989 to January 31, 1990 is entitled to service credit under this subsection.

STATEMENT OF FACT

Under current law, members of the Maine State Retirement System who served in the armed forces, regardless of location, during any federally recognized period of conflict are entitled to retirement credit for this service. This bill adds to this entitlement those who served in Grenada and Panama during the periods of conflict in those countries.
