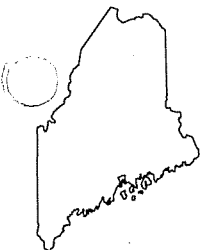

An Act to Increase Eligibility for the Elderly Low-cost Drug Program.



Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

2. **Income.** ~~Eligibility--for--this--program--shall--be

8 household must have income of \$10,000 or less. A household with 2
10 or more members must have income of \$12,400 or less.
