3. Tire wholesalers. Any person selling tires at wholesale
2 shall accept, at the point of transfer, in a quantity at least equal to the number of tires sold, used tires from customers. A
4 person accepting tires in transfer from a tire retailer is allowed a period, not to exceed 90 days, to remove tires from the
6 retail point of collection.

8 <u>4. Inspection and enforcement. The department shall</u> produce, print and distribute notices required under subsection 10 <u>2. The department shall enforce the provisions of this section</u> and may inspect places, buildings or premises governed by this 12 <u>section.</u>

5. Violations. Any person who does not abide by this section commits a civil violation subject to section 349.

STATEMENT OF FACT

22 This bill assures that used tires are managed in a safe and controlled manner. It prohibits the disposal of tires except 24 through a tire retailer or wholesaler.
