This bill establishes a limit on noneconomic damages in medical liability actions and will have an impact on professional liability claims. Costs to the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation, Bureau of Insurance, related to the consideration of insurer filed and approved rates and increased limit charges, can be absorbed by the bureau within existing resources.

If the Joint Standing Committee on Judiciary is required to hold meetings to study the impact of this bill when the Legislature is not in session, the Legislature will require a General Fund appropriation for the per diem and expenses of the members of that committee. The exact amount of the appropriation required can not be determined.'

## STATEMENT OF FACT

24 This amendment raises the limit on noneconomic damages allowed to \$500,000 and requires the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over judiciary matters to 26 study the impact of the limitation and report to the Legislature 28 by November 1, 1993.
