32	The revised exemption will simplify the administrative requirements of the Department of Economic and Community Development, Office of Energy Resources, but will expand the
34	enforcement requirements beyond that enacted by Public Law 1987, chapter 818, which did not provide any resources for
36	enforcement. Additional General Fund appropriations will be required to enforce mandatory standards. However, the additional
38	funding directly related to this bill's expansion of the
40	enforcement requirements can not be determined at this time.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment replaces the bill. The amendment amends the exemptions in the State's mandatory standards for residential construction by restricting the "owner-built home" exemption to single-family residential buildings that physically are constructed by the people who own and live in the buildings.
