An Act to Repeal Legislative Salary and Benefit Increases Granted in 1989.



#### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 3 MRSA §2, first ¶, as affected by PL 1989, c. 878, Pt. D,  $\S$ 14 and 15, is amended to read:

Each member of the Senate and House of Representatives, 6 beginning with the first Wednesday of December 1990 1991 and thereafter, shall receive is entitled to \$10,500 \$9,900 in the first year and \$7,500 \$6,600 in the 2nd year of each blennium, 10 and shall must be paid for travel at each legislative session once each week at the same rate per mile to and from that 12 Legislator's place of abode as state employees receive, mileage to be determined by the most reasonable direct route, except that Legislators may be reimbursed for tolls paid for 14 travel on the Maine Turnpike provided they have a receipt for payment of the tolls, such tolls to be reimbursed when Legislators use the Maine Turnpike in traveling to and from BUT WAR sessions of the Legislature or in performance of duly authorized [PQ[ ? grasscommittee] assignments. the members of the Senate and House of Representatives shall are each be--compensated \$100 entitled to \$55 for every day's attendance, expenses and mileage pursuant to this section.

Sec. 4. 3 MRSA  $\S2$ , 8th  $\P$ , as affected by PL 1989, c. 878, Pt. D,  $\S\S14$  and 15, is amended to read:

The member of the Penobscot Indian Nation and the member of the Passamaquoddy Indian Tribe elected to represent their tribes at the Legislature shall-receive a are entitled to compensation of \$110 \$100 for each day's attendance during the first and 2nd regular sessions and allowance for meals, constituent service, housing and travel expenses as any other member of the Senate and House of Representatives for attendance at each legislative session. For the duration of any special session of the Legislature, they shall-receive are entitled to the same allowances, including housing, meal and travel expenses, as any other member of the Senate and House of Representatives.

Representatives shall-receive is entitled to \$55 for every day's attendance when meetings or daily sessions are held, a meal allowance in the amount of \$32 \$26 and a housing allowance whereby actual lodging expenses will-be are reimbursed at the single-room rate, provided that a receipt is submitted to the Executive Director of the Legislative Council for each day in attendance at such meetings or daily sessions and for each day that member occupies overnight accommodations away from home either immediately preceding or immediately following attendance at daily sessions of the Legislature and actual daily mileage allowances which shall-be are paid at the same rate paid to state In lieu of the meal and housing allowance, each employees. member shall-be is entitled to a daily meal allowance in the amount of \$32 \$26 and actual daily mileage allowances.

Sec. 6. 3 MRSA §2, 12th ¶, as affected by PL 1989, c. 878, Pt. D, §§14 and 15, is amended to read:

If a member of the Legislature dies or otherwise vacates the office, the successor is entitled to a salary from the date of seating, computed as follows: two one hundred ten eighty dollars per week times the number of weeks remaining in the calendar year if the vacancy occurs in the first year and \$150 \$120 per week

STATEMENT OF FACT

8 This bill returns the rate of legislative salary to \$9,900 during the first year and \$6,600 during the 2nd year of the 10 biennium. It also returns the housing allowance to \$34 per day, the meal allowance to \$26 per day and the special session per 12 diem to the rate of \$55 per day. These are the rates that were in effect before December 5, 1990.
