F. Upon complete payment of the contributions under paragraph C, the member must be granted service credit for the period of time for which the contributions have been made. Upon making partial payment of the contributions under paragraph C, the member must be granted service credit on a pro rata basis in accordance with rules adopted by the board.

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FISCAL NOTE

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This bill will allow more members of the Maine State Retirement System to purchase service credits for up to 10 years spent as a parochial or private school teacher and, consequently, will increase future employer contributions for state employees and teachers to the Maine State Retirement System. The actual increase can only be determined after application for the purchase, as it depends upon the age, service, sex and salary of the member and the number of years purchased.'

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STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment replaces the bill. The amendment changes the conditions under which a member of the retirement system who taught in a parochial school or in a public or private academy may purchase service credit and adds those provisions to the laws relating to participating local districts. This amendment also adds a fiscal note.
