IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND NINETY-ONE

An Act to Prohibit the Use of All-terrain Vehicles in State Parks.



Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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- Sec. 1. 12 MRSA \$602, sub-\$15, ¶B, as amended by PL 1973, c. 460, \$19, is further amended to read:
 - B. The Maine Trails System shall-eensist consists of:
 - (1) Recreational trails. Trails designated to provide a variety of recreational opportunities. Recreational trails may be limited to foot, horse or other nonmotorized means of transportation, or motorized means of transportation or combination thereof, as deemed appropriate by the director except that ATV's used for recreational purposes are not allowed on state-owned land that was designated as a state park prior to January 1, 1989;
 - (2) Primitive trails. Trails providing appreciation of natural and primitive areas and for the conservation of significant scenic, historic, natural or cultural qualities of the areas through which the trails pass and offering primarily the experience of solitude and self-reliance in natural or near-natural surroundings. Rights-of-way and buffer areas may be established and maintained to further that experience and no use or development shall-be is permitted which threatens such primitive character. Nothing in this subsection shall may be construed as excluding from a primitive trail system areas of development, provided that such areas are deemed by the director to be relatively insignificant compared to the system as a whole, or that such development either is not likely to remain or leave a lasting mark or is integral to the trail system itself. Primitive trails may be restricted foot traffic, including hiking, snowshoeing and skiing, except in those areas where the trails are on existing roads. The Appalachian Trail shall--be is included as a primitive trail in the Maine Trails System and other trails may also be included -: and
 - (3) Facilities. Camp sites, shelters and related public-use and management facilities to the extent that they do not interfere with the nature and purposes of the trails which they serve-:

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 3. Recording of permission. Whenever the Bureau of Parks and Recreation or an ATV club obtains permission to operate an ATV on the land of another, the name of the owner and the location of the property must be given to the Bureau of Parks and
