An Act Regarding Judgment Notices in Small Claims Proceedings.



### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

	14 MRSA	§7484,	sub-§4-A, as	enacted	by	PL	1989,	c.	378,	§2,
is	amended to	read:								

4-A. Judgment; entry; notice. Upon completion of the hearing, the court shall promptly enter judgment for the prevailing party for the relief to which that party is entitled. The clerk shall provide to the parties a copy of the notice of judgment which shall must require satisfaction of the judgment within 30 days. Upon the request of either party, the clerk shall schedule a disclosure hearing on a date certain, to be held if the judgment is not satisfied, and shall notice of disclosure hearing must inform the judgment debtor that failure to appear at the scheduled disclosure hearing may result in the issue issuance of summary-process a civil order of arrest if requested by the judgment creditor; and

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#### STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill amends the laws concerning small claims proceedings to include in the notice informing the defendant of a disclosure hearing that, if the defendant does not appear, a civil order of arrest may be issued if requested by the judgment creditor.

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
