### \$1326. Time and method of restitution

When restitution is authorized, the time and method of payment or of the performance of the services shall must be Menetary Except when the offender is placed on 10 probation, monetary compensation which--is--not--to--be--paid--in installments-or-at-a-later-specified-time-shall-be-paid-to-the 12 elerk-of-the-court-having-jurisdietion-over-the-offender must be ordered paid to the office of the prosecuting attorney who is 14 prosecuting the case. This bill provides for the payment of all restitution to the offices of the prosecuting attorneys or the Department of Corrections, Division of Probation and Parole which are the agencies that enforce payment of restitution.
