COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "/" to H.P. 293, L.D. 414, Bill, "An Act to Require State Audit and Review of Quasi-municipal Corporations Granted by State Charter"

Amend the bill by striking everything after the enacting 18 clause and before the statement of fact and inserting in its place the following:

'Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §243, sub-§3-B is enacted to read:

3-B. Audit and review of quasi-municipal corporations. To 24 establish procedures for and perform annual audits and reviews of all accounts and other financial records of quasi-municipal corporations established under state charter, as defined in Title 26 30-A, section 2351, that have an annual budget of more than 28 \$25,000 and are not subject to audit and review by another state or federal agency including the Public Utilities Commission. 30 Audits under this subsection must be performed by a licensed public accountant and sent to the State Auditor. The expense of these audits and reviews must be paid completely by the 32 guasi-municipal corporations. Quasi-municipal corporations that 34 have annual budgets of less than \$25,000 are exempt from this subsection;

the Public Utilities Commission, are required to submit to and cooperate with an annual state audit and review as provided in Title 5, section 243, subsection 3-B.

1. State Auditor: costs. Upon written petition by 25 ratepayers or members of a quasi-municipal corporation, the State Auditor must review and, based upon the review findings, may audit the financial statements of a quasi-municipal corporation. All costs associated with the audit and review must be paid by the quasi-municipal corporation.

 <u>2. Requirements. The quasi-municipal corporation shall</u> provide whatever documentation or information the State Auditor
<u>requires.</u>

16 3. Findings. The findings of the State Auditor are public documents. Copies of the findings must be sent to the municipal 18 officers in the municipalities where the quasi-municipal corporation provides services and to any appropriate state agency 20 that has jurisdiction over the subject matter of the corporation's area of operation, including but not limited to the 22 Public Utilities Commission and the Department of Transportation.

4. Forms. The State Auditor shall develop a form that shows a breakdown of all expenses and revenues of the guasi-municipal corporation. The form must be developed so that the average citizen can understand the information requested on the form. The form must accompany all certified audits and be filed with the appropriate agency.

FISCAL NOTE

34 This bill requires the State Auditor to review and conduct audits of quasi-municipal corporations if petitioned to do so, 36 with all costs to be paid by the quasi-municipal corporations. An allocation of dedicated revenue and authorization for 38 additional auditor positions to the Department of Audit will be necessary based upon the number of these corporations that will 40 be audited. The number of reviews and audits to be performed are not known at this time.

The Department of Audit will absorb the costs associated with developing a form showing the expenses and revenues of quasi-municipal corporations.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

50 This amendment exempts quasi-municipal corporations that are subject to audit by other state or federal agencies from an 52 additional audit. It also exempts quasi-municipal corporations

with annual budgets of less than \$25,000. Further, it requires that:

1. The audits be completed by licensed public accountants;

- 2. Upon written petition by 25 consumers or members of a quasi-municipal corporation, the State Auditor complete a review of the quasi-municipal's financial records; and

3. The State Auditor develop forms that must be submitted with the certified audit by the quasi-municipal corporation.

The amendment also adds a fiscal note.
