IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND NINETY-ONE

An Act to Require State Audit and Review of Quasi-municipal Corporations Granted by State Charter.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §243, sub-§ 3-B is enacted to read:

3-B. Audit and review of guasi-municipal corporations. To
establish procedures for and perform annual audits and reviews of all accounts and other financial records of all guasi-municipal
corporations established under state charter, as defined in Title
30-A, section 2351. Upon completion of the audits and reviews,
the auditor shall submit final public reports to the appropriate municipal officers and any state agencies that have subject
matter jurisdiction in the guasi-municipal corporations' areas of operation. The expense of these audits and reviews must be paid
completely by the guasi-municipal corporations;

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18 <u>§2358. Required state audit and review</u>

20 <u>quasi-municipal corporations established under state charter are</u> 22 <u>required to submit to and cooperate with an annual state audit</u> <u>and review pursuant to Title 5, section 243, subsection 3-B.</u>

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 State auditor; costs. The audit and review must be
conducted by the State Auditor. All costs associated with the audit and review must be paid for by the guasi-municipal
corporation.

30 <u>2. Requirements. The quasi-municipal corporation shall</u>
<u>provide whatever documentation or information the State Auditor</u>
32 <u>requires by rule.</u>

34 3. Report. The final report of the State Auditor is a public document. Copies of the report must be sent to the municipal officers in the municipalities where the corporation provides services and to any appropriate state agency that has
38 jurisdiction over the subject matter of the corporation's area of operation, including but not limited to the Public Utilities
40 Commission and the Department of Transportation.

STATEMENT OF FACT

44 This bill adds the creation and implementation of an annual audit and review process of quasi-municipal corporations to the 46 the State Auditor. The bill also requires duties of quasi-municipal corporations to participate in these audits and 48 pay any associated costs. Further, reports resulting from these audits and reviews are declared public documents and their 50 distribution to appropriate municipal officials and state agencies is required. 52
