An Act to Amend the Laws Regarding Archery Hunting Licenses.

Comment of the comment

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

12 MRSA §7102, sub-§7, as enacted by PL 1987, c. 354, §1, is amended to read:

7. Archery hunter training program requirements. Any person who applies for an archery hunting license, other than a junior license, shall submit proof of having successfully completed an education course of the type described in subsection 8 and approved by the commissioner, or satisfactory evidence of having previously held an adult archery hunting license or a junior hunting license in this State or any other state, province or country in-any-year-after-1977, or having successfully completed a hunter safety course as provided in section 7035, subsection 10.

When proof or evidence cannot can not otherwise be provided, the person may substitute a signed affidavit that he the person has previously held the required adult archery hunting license or junior hunting license or that he the person has successfully completed the required archery hunter education course.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill changes the archery hunting training program requirements so that those who have held a junior hunting license are not required to submit proof of having completed an archery hunter education program or a hunting safety course. This bill also allows those who have held at any time an archery hunting license or junior archery hunting license to avoid the archery hunter training program requirements.
