IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND NINETY-ONE

An Act to Increase the Probationary Period for Teacher Employment.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §13201, 2nd ¶, as enacted by PL 1981, c. 693, \S and 8, is amended to read:

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After a probationary period not to exceed 2 3 years, subsequent contracts of duly certified teachers shall must be for not less than 2 years. Unless a duly certified teacher receives written notice to the contrary at least 6 months before the terminal date of the contract, the contract shall-be is extended automatically for one year and similarly in subsequent years. The right to an extension for a longer period of time through a new contract is specifically reserved to the contracting parties.

Sec. 2. 20-A MRSA §13201, 4th ¶, as amended by PL 1983, c. 806, \S 93, is further amended to read:

After a probationary period of 2 3 years, any teacher, who 18 receives notice in accordance with this section that his-or-herthe teacher's contract is not going to be renewed, may, during 20 the 15 days following such notification, request a hearing with 22 the school board. The teacher may request reasons. The hearing shall must be private except by mutual consent and except that 24 either or both parties may be represented by counsel. That hearing must be granted within 30 days of the receipt of the 26 teacher's request.

STATEMENT OF FACT

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This bill changes the probationary period for teachers from 2 to 3 years. 34
