An Act Concerning Waste Management.

(EMERGENCY)

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the space in landfills is severely limited and at a critical state; and

Whereas, effective disposal alternatives exist for certain materials that are currently deposited in landfills; and

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Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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Sec. 1. 38 MRSA §1303-C, sub-§47 is enacted to read:

 <u>47. Yard wastes.</u> "Yard wastes" means grass clippings,
22 <u>leaves and other vegetal matter other than wood wastes and land</u> clearing debris.
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Sec. 2. 38 MRSA §1304, sub-§13, as affected by PL 1989, c. 890, Pt. A, §40 and as amended by Pt. B, §229, is further amended to read:

Innovative disposal and utilization. Recognizing that 13. environmentally suitable sites for waste disposal are in limited 30 and represent а critical natural resource, the supply 32 commissioner may investigate and implement with the approval of the board innovative programs for managing, utilizing and 34 disposing of solid waste. Innovative programs may include agricultural and forest land spreading of wood-derived ash, utilization of ash resulting from combustion of municipal solid 36 waste, paper mill sludges and, municipal waste water treatment plant sludges and the composting of yard wastes. 38 The agency shall first determine that the proposed innovative disposal and waste management programs are consistent with the state plan. 40The commissioner shall review proposed innovative programs for 42 each waste category and shall apply all controls necessary to ensure the protection of the environment and public health consistent with this chapter. The board may adopt application 44 review procedures designed to review individual applications and their individual waste sources with prior approval of classes of 46 disposal or utilization sites. The board shall adopt provisions for municipal notification prior to use of individual utilization 48 sites.

In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act takes effect when approved. 34 36 STATEMENT OF FACT 38 This bill prohibits the landfilling of yard waste and 40 encourages the development and implementation of composting The bill also amends the solid waste facility programs. licensing law to exempt the disposal of construction and 42 demolition debris, land clearing debris and wood wastes from licensing requirements if the disposal facility is less than one 44 acre in size and only one exempt disposal facility is located on a single parcel of property. 46
